Medical Article Title

- (the common name for it)

Prevalence/epidemiology if possible

Etiology and pathogenesis (simple enough for the patient to understand)

Symptoms

Diagnosis (including objective examination and paraclinical tests - blood, urine, body fluids, microscopy, imaging etc)

Treatment (explain holistically first e.g. the goal of treatment, then write the treatment options - lifestyle, medical and/ or surgical)

Prognosis

Any other notes to add?

Sources - do this by citation. Below is a list of how to cite from medical journals, webpages and etc:

1) From a webpage:

Last, F. M. (Year, Month Date Published). *Article title*. Retrieved from URL

EXAMPLE: Satalkar, B. (2010, July 15). *Water aerobics*. Retrieved from <http://www.buzzle.com>

2) From a Journal in Print:

Last, F. M., & Last, F. M. (Year Published). Article title. *Journal Name*, Volume(Issue), pp. Pages.

EXAMPLE:

Jacoby, W. G. (1994). Public attitudes toward government spending. *American Journal of Political Science*, 38(2), 336-361.

OR:

Fearon, J. D., & Laitin, D. D. (2003). Ethnicity, Insurgency, and Civil War. *American Political Science Review*, 97(01), 75. doi: 10.1017/S0003055403000534

3) From a Journal online:

Last, F. M. (Year Published). Article title. *Journal Name*, Volume(Issue), pp. Page(s). doi:# or Retrieved from URL

EXAMPLE:

Poiger, U. G. (1996). Rock 'n' roll, female sexuality, and the Cold War Battle over German Identities. *The Journal of Modern History*, 68(3), 577. doi:10.1086/245343

4) From A journal on a database:

Last, F. M. (Year Published). Article title. *Journal Name*, Volume(Issue), pp. Page(s). Retrieved from URL

EXAMPLE:

Jacoby, W. G. (1994). Public attitudes toward government spending. *American Journal of Political Science*, 38(2), 336-361. Retrieved from <http://www.jstor.org>.

OR:

Davis, E. (1932). New chapters in American history. *The Science News-Letter*, 22(605), 306-307. doi: 10.2307/3907973

5) From a book in print:

Last, F. M. (Year Published) *Book*. City, State: Publisher.

EXAMPLE:

Rowling, J.K. (2001). *Harry Potter and the socerer's stone*. London: Bloomsburg Children's.

6) From a book online:

Last, F. M. (Year Published) *Book*. Retrieved from URL

Example:

James, H. (2009). *The ambassadors*. Retrieved from <http://books.google.com>

If you cannot find the date the article was updated or published simple write (n.d.) instead of a date. Most medical jorunals already have their own citation on the their article. You can also just use that one. The citations should be at the end of the article you write.
